
Socioeconomic status is a reasonable proxy for deprivation

Deprivation: Degree of disadvantage


Socioeconomic Status

- Position of an individual or group on the socioeconomic scale.
- Combination of social and economic factors.
- Often reveal inequities in access to resources, as well as issues related to privilege, power, and control.




How do you measure SES?


There is no universally accepted way to measure SES... but here are 3 common approaches used in Canadian Public Health Sciences:

- 1. Pampalon Index
- 2. Canadian Marginalization Index
- 3. Socioeconomic Factor Index







Distribution of breaks




Distribution of breaks




Distribution of breaks




Median # of breaks





Province of New Brunswick




Are there inequities in the days under a boil water advisory among New Brunswick's drinking water utilities based on customer socioeconomic status?





"What gets measured gets managed"






