#### WHAT IS THE BC SMALL WATER SYSTEMS COMMUNITY NETWORK?

- » A FREE online platform designed to be a safe place for small water systems owners and their teams to meet their peers, find resources and expertise, and stay current on relevant topics.
- » Open to anyone who is involved with or is interested in small water systems in British Columbia.





#### WHY SMALL WATER SYSTEMS?



- More than 2 connections, serving up to 500 people in a 24hour period
- They are an extremely diverse community
  - Residential, recreational, commercial, industrial, mixed
  - Full-time, part-time and seasonal residents
  - Wide range of governance structures (private, society, First Nations, public, etc.)
  - Water treatment ranges from none to complex processes
- Lack of capacity, funding, time, and {potentially} experience
- Approximately 4000 small systems in British Columbia

# SO... HOW DID WE GET HERE?

- 2019 Auditor General's Report highlighted concerns with small water systems including:
  - Large number of boil water advisories
  - Concerns about long-term financial and infrastructure sustainability
- The BCWWA was asked to provide a scaled solution for SWS decision makers throughout BC:
  - Support the development of peer networks
  - Curate valuable resources
  - Continue providing the *Taking Care of Your Small Water System* workshop








#### **PROJECT GOALS**



# WE TALKED TO THE COMMUNITY!

- ✓ **Survey** distributed to small water system owners across the province with help from the Health Authorities
- ✓ Phone survey of individuals who attended Taking Care of Your Small Water System workshop in the past
- ✓ Survey distributed to small water system supporters
- ✓ Focus groups of small water systems owners
- ✓ Focus groups of small water systems supporters



# WHAT DID THE COMMUNITY TELL US?

- The majority of respondents (75%) had less than 50 connections
- 58% had only 1 operator (certified or uncertified) for their system
- SWS Owners often don't know who their peers are
- SWS Owners often aren't aware of the resources around them
- SWS Owners were saw the importance of supporters but didn't want to be seen as a marketing list or to have a regulatory body "looking over their shoulder"






# WHAT DID THE COMMUNITY TELL US?

- Varying level of trust between Owners and regulatory bodies (ie: MOH, HAs)
- Turnover is an issue (trustees, volunteers, staff)
  - Who will run the system?
  - How do they get up to speed to make good decisions?
- Funding is an issue
  - Small water user base ... less money
  - Minimal access to government funding or grants
- Climate change is affecting small water systems

- Private area for peer-to-peer engagement
- Privacy levels are managed by each member

- Actively encourages engagement and feedback from members






#### **COMMUNITY NETWORK LAYOUT**





# Lessons Learned





#### 1. ENCOURAGE MEMBER INVOLVEMENT

- » Provide opportunities for members to contribute their **own content**.
- » Allow members to control their own privacy settings and involvement level.
- » **Push content to members** (*Weekly Digest*) to encourage them to return to the platform.
- » Provide opportunities for members to meet other members (Coffee with the Community).





#### 2. THE COMMUNITY NETWORK CANNOT STAGNATE

- » Invest in staff resources to ensure a safe environment and regularly refreshed content.
- » Curate information, articles and notifications.
- » Seek out supporters who can contribute to the richness of the site.
  - Academia
  - Manufacturers/suppliers
  - Other associations
  - Government program areas




